Worship update:

With great joy, Grace began to offer in-person OUTDOOR worship on Easter Sunday. With the cooperation of our worshipers wearing masks and maintaining 6' of distance between households, we believe that we can continue to offer safe, weekly



outdoor worship on Sundays at 10:15 am. We recognize that some churches are providing indoor in-person worship, but Grace will continue to refrain from the indoor gatherings due to the rising number of new cases & increasing positivity rate. (Montgomery County does not meet any of the 3 metrics for "safe" indoor gatherings.) Grace is choosing to be a congregation that doesn't potentially spread this virus or increase the likelihood that virus variations will become greater threats.

We know this is hard. We thank you for your patience as we get closer to gathering indoors. We invite you to participate in the life of the church through outdoor worship on Sundays at 10:15am (office lawn) or joining the livestream on Youtube at 9 am. (And check out our online bible studies, Pub Theology, coffee hour, and other events that gather us as Church!)

While we wait for fuller "openings", the council is excited and enthusiastic about what is ahead! We are praying and planning and listening and visioning and working towards God's tomorrow. Please join us in living into God's vision for a safe and healthy creation.

STRUNK FUND APPLICATIONS

Letters of application are being accepted now through the end of May for scholarships for 2 or 4 year colleges, or trade schools. You must be enrolled as a



full-time student, in an undergraduate degree program. You may only be eligible for this scholarship for a maximum of four (4) years. Awards will be given in July/August. The committee will announce the recipients of the scholarships in June. All applicants must be a baptized/confirmed member of Grace Lutheran Church and new applicants are required to write a letter of application which includes the following information:

1.Your service & manner of attendance to Sunday School and church. If you are worshiping online at Grace, submit a selfie that shows you worshiping online OR a screen shot of the service.

- 2. List youth group activities, which must include service projects (i.e. work camps, work days, national youth gathering, etc.).
- 3. Your high school scholastic record if you are to start college, or past college records if you are in college presently. Copies of official transcripts must be included.
- 4. Name of school, course selections & whether you will be a resident or commuter student.
- 5. Civic organizations and high school activities in which you participate.
- 6. If you previously received a grant from the Strunk Fund, the following information is required: an official school transcript and list of your activities since your last application.
 - A. College transcripts, must have a minimum 2.0 average to be eligible for consideration.
 - B. Participation in a service project either at college, in the community or the church & a letter from the organization, stating your involvement.
 - C. Regular worship attendance at a church or chapel, while at college. Worship may be:
 - 1- In-person (Submit bulletin or picture from worship service)
 - 2- Online (Submit a selfie showing you worshiping online OR a screen shot of online service)
 - 3- Campus bible study group (Submit selfie that shows you with group)
 - D. Regular worship attendance at Grace, while home for breaks.

Applications are to be received by the church office by May 31st and clearly marked as Strunk Fund Application. No applications will be accepted after May 31st. A submitted application does not guarantee a scholarship.
