Worship update:

safely gather in-person again soon. These changes will be communicated to you via the website and email. (If you are not receiving emails from Grace, check your spam folder or call the office to make sure you are on our list!)

Once we can gather again in-person, we will all still need to maintain the current safety guidelines – at home, in our neighborhoods, and at church. Per the Montgomery County Office of Public Health: wear your masks, maintain 6 feet of social distance, wash hands frequently, work from home when possible, refrain from going out as much as possible. And now... get your vaccine when you become eligible! This becomes the next way we show love to our neighbors! (and to ourselves!)

For now, please pray for all who have been and remain affected by Corona virus. May health be restored, grieving hearts find peace, and rest be found.

From The Deacon's Desk: Lent in a Year of Lent It was Lent when we last met together as a communication.

It was Lent when we last met together as a community at Grace. As of this month, that's 11 months ago. It was a year ago this month that Darrell Lewis and I gave out ashes at Phoenixville Hospital on Ash Wednesday. At the time, I remember the staff – nurses and doctors – asked for prayers as they prepared to face this strange new virus that was spreading. In many ways it still feels like

Lent. We did celebrate both Easter and Christmas over these past 11 months, but the slowness of the time and the quieter way in which they were celebrated was out of our norm.

And now we enter Lent again. How do we acknowledge that in this Lenten "year?" How do we enter a time of repentance in a year where there was so much suffering? This year, our Lenten focus will be on grief: the griefs we share and the griefs we've faced alone. Our hope is that in the sharing of our grief, we might move toward Easter with hearts that have been somewhat unburdened. Water is not a Renewable Resource?

The earth's surface is split about 29% land and 71% water, and has been estimated at 326 million trillion gallons (yes, that is 326 followed by 18 zeros). It sure sounds like plenty of water doesn't it? And it is the same amount of water we've had since the earth was formed!

God blessed us with a marvelous, automated, **Reuse** and **Recycle** process to recycle the finite water resources on our earthly home - evaporation, transpiration, condensation, precipitation, runoff, repeat.

But not all of that 326 million trillion gallons are available for us to use at any point in time. A vast amount of that water (97%) is in the form of salty ocean water, which is difficult and expensive to harvest into drinkable water. And you are walking around with quite a bit of water as well since up to 60% of an adult human body is water. There is water in the glaciers, clouds and even water you can't see in aquifers underground.

For those of you that get your water from a well, you are harvesting the water from those underground aquifers. And you are all too aware of a significant issue with the water cycle. Accessibility. Depending on how deep your well is, the word "drought" can make even the most mild-mannered parents turn into the "shower police" (been there, done that), dreading the thought (and cost) of drilling a deeper well, or worse yet, a dried up aquifer! As are most of God's blessings, His water cycle works on God's time, not ours. Some places are flooding while others may be experiencing a water shortage, and it is difficult to manually distribute the excess flood water from the US to farmers facing a drought in Africa.

Since water is not very portable and there is no way to know when we may face a water shortage, it is important we are good stewards of the water we have, when we have it. Don't pollute, and do your part to take care of that third R, **Reduce**, that God left in our hands.

Things you can do to **Reduce** your water usage include turning off the water while you brush your teeth, spending less time in the shower (1 less minute a day saves an average of 1638 gallons a year), purchasing a water saving shower head, setting the level on your washing machine for the correct size load, and fix those leaks just to name a few. On a more global level, remember that everything from crops we eat, crops to feed livestock we eat, and even crops to grow that cotton for our clothes use water. The <u>FDA</u> estimates that about 30-40% of all food in the US is wasted. Did you know it takes about 2637 gallons of water to make a pair of jeans! Be a good steward of the gifts God has blessed you with, or to quote my Mom, "Waste not, want not".
