From the Deacon's Desk: Journey through Lent

I normally don't cover the same things in my newsletter piece as I did the month before, but I wanted again to encourage you to think about participating in some of our adult formation opportunities. There is still plenty of time to join in. This Lent, ask if maybe God is nudging you to dive in a little more deeply to your spiritual formation. As always, spending time with scripture is a wonderful way to grow in your faith, and our study of

Matthew is ongoing on Mondays at 7pm via Zoom, or in person on Thursday mornings at 10am.

If you are looking for something for a shorter term, join our Lenten Study on Wednesday evenings via Zoom where we will discuss the Holy Spirit's movement in our lives - and the journeys the Spirit moves us through. We'll be using Henri Nouwen's Book, Following the Movements of the Spirit as a guide.

Another short-term offering is the "Grief Lectionary," a program that uses stories from scripture to guide participants through the stages of grief. The group will be able to offer support to each other as the sessions end.

And don't forget every Sunday morning at 9:15 am we have a book club meeting in the parlor led by Judy Stryker. They are reading the book Traveling Mercies by Anne Lamott. Or, join in the fellowship conversation with the group led by Richard Harshaw at the same time.

Grief Lectionary: The 6-week course called "The Grief Lectionary" will begin in March. This small group study is meant to be a companion for grieving people of faith using the Bible as a guide. We will meet on the following Sundays after the second service at 11:30am, in the Parlor. Each session is about 75 minutes long so we will finish before 1:00pm.
