TRANSITION

FROM TH Transition is simply the process of getting from one place to another. We do it all the time. When we move from room to room, house to car, store to store. These transitions feel different because they are familiar to us. We have practiced them so often we don't really notice. The current transition at Grace most likely feels different. It has been some time since this community has experienced this kind of transition. It likely feels less familiar, less practiced, and a bit more unsettling.

This is why the Southeastern Pennsylvania Synod, ELCA provides Interims like me to come, live with, and walk with you through this transition. I have done this several times. I have some special training to help you do this. Together we can do this, and do it well.

We have begun to recruit persons to serve on the Transition Team. This is a group of four or five persons who know this congregation very well. Who love this faith community. Who will lead us in some activities to help us see ourselves more clearly. This will allow us to articulate for pastoral candidates who we are, what we value, and how we understand God is calling us to serve.

It is okay to be anxious. This is new stuff. It is not okay to get crazy and loose all perspective. If you are concerned in any way about this transition I would love to hear from you. Please be in touch with me so we can arrange a time to talk. We transition all the time. Together we can make this transition into whatever is next for Grace Lutheran Church.

- Carillon Concerts at Valley Forge—July brings the return of the Carillon Outdoor Concerts at the Washington Memorial Chapel in Valley Forge on Weds evenings at 7:30pm. Bring your chair, a beverage & snacks or purchase something from the Cabin Shop Cafe. They do take a freewill offering during the concert.



The carillon consists of 58 tuned bronze bells played entirely by hand. Their website states the bells range from 13 1/2 pounds to 8,000 pounds and cover a range of nearly 5 octaves! It is awe-inspiring! The carillonneurs come from far & wide to perform: 7/5 from Florida, 7/12 from the Netherlands, 7/19 from California & 7/26 from New York. The much beloved bagpipe performance will be held on 8/23. Hope to see you at the concerts!
