It is pretty easy to notice the days are getting shorter. It is darker when I arise, and much darker before I retire. We are well into the fall season.



Already some of the vegetables have run their course, and it won't be long before the leaves begin to turn, dry, and fall. For many it is a difficult season as it brings anxiety about dying. This is an anxiety that drains much of the joy out of life and can often leave one sad and depressed.

God is well aware of these feelings. For God established dying as an intricate part of the created order. Remember from Genesis 3:22 "And the Lord God said, 'This man has now become like one of us, knowing good from evil. He must not be allowed to reach out his hand and take also from the tree of life and eat, and live forever." Because of Adam's disobedience God banished him from paradise and declared human life will be hard. We will endure heartbreak, hardships, obstacles, and death. This is just how it is.

AND God declared more – there will be resurrection. God sent Jesus to live among us, to take all humanity could throw at him, to suffer, to die, AND to be raised – RESURRECTED so we could see and know death is not the end. The death we so fear, be it of body, mind, dream, job, family, what ever, is not permanent. God has promised us resurrection, new life. I know that in the midst of dying this can be difficult to claim. But that does not make God's promise any less so.
