We don't like to wait. We just don't. Whether that is in the check out line, at the traffic light, or for the app to stop spinning, we don't like waiting. It has become, it seems to me, a way of life – going faster and faster and



faster—like the driver on the highway (my mother's pet peeve) who speeds up, raises past you, cuts in front of you to take the off ramp. Couldn't they have waited just a moment?

We want to get there sooner. As I look around our neighborhoods, we already see holiday lights and Christmas decorations, and we haven't even gotten to Thanksgiving week. A National Day of Thanksgiving to remember all our many blessings has gotten dislodged by Black Friday shopping (which if you haven't noticed has become more like a month than a day), decorating for Christmas, and Cyber Monday. Ironically, we are in such a hurry not to miss anything, we are missing a great deal. We are moving so fast; we have given away the great gift (yes gift) of waiting.

When we wait, in that moment just before ... (the movie starts, the curtain rises, a loved one speaks) ... we are gifted with a moment when anything is possible.

In Luke 4 we hear Jesus is in the synagogue for worship, as was his custom, when he was handed the scroll from which he read, then he sat down ... "The eyes of all in the synagogue were fixed on him" in anticipation of what was to come, of what might be. Imagine the intense anticipation of what Jesus was about to share.

The season of Advent, the four weeks preceding Christmas Day, is a time of waiting. A time to anticipate the arrival of the Christ child. Don't race to the end of the story. Don't jump ahead and read the last chapter. Slow down just a little, engage the journey more deeply, notice the sights, the sounds, and the smells. Take a breath and wait. In that space of anticipation, we are encountered by the Holy Spirit. In that waiting space our Lord has an opportunity to reach into our chaotic life and touch our us with hope and possibility and joy and peace.

There is more, much, much more to this journey than just the destination.
