When a person, or a group, excludes us, judges our warts, scars, and

shortcomings as being unacceptable we are changed, even scarred. When we have been dismissed in this way, our ability to hear, grasp, and trust God's love is compromised. Being excluded makes it difficult for us to hope.

Jesus spent much of his earthly ministry going to great lengths to see and acknowledge the most marginalized persons of his day, to give them a way to hope. Jesus made a point of sitting, eating, walking, and talking with the very persons others left out so they were not dismissed.

We have been gifted to do this too. Every time we accept & see another (not having to fix anything) we provide an environment for hope. Each time we give this gift a small new plant may poke its head up through the soil, with the potential to grow larger and deeper.

Belonging matters!

As part of our monthly Council meeting, we reflect on including others. We discuss how Grace might better make space for "others" to belong here. From the Deacon's Desk: Who and how are we welcoming?



The gospel reading for June 9th (Mark 3:20-35) is a scene where Jesus is confronted by the two groups he belongs to - his family and those who are leaders in his religion. But in the reading, we see Jesus have strong words of rebuke for both of them. In fact, most often in the gospels the people Jesus has the strongest words of condemnation for are the religious leaders. Instead, the people Jesus aligns himself with are the marginalized and the outsiders: the lepers, the poor, the widows, the tax collectors, the prostitutes.

Jesus radically welcomes people who aren't usually welcomed by the mainstream religious leaders. There's a message in this gospel readings for us to caution against deciding for ourselves who is in and who is out. Who is it that we can welcome the way Jesus welcomes? Who is it that we might be excluding without realizing it?

On Sunday, June 8th from 8:30 am to 9:15 am in the parlor, I'll be leading a discussion on radical welcome. How can we welcome those who are different from ourselves with the same love that Jesus would?

I hope you'll join me!

About this time a year ago, we planted the garden for our 11th season. This morning, Monday, May 13th, the garden was decommissioned! All of the raised beds built by the boy scouts in 2013 had severely rotted. The fence was a mess after a huge branch fell on it last year. We would have faced a major rebuild to make the garden look good again. The future of this space is yet to be determined, but for 11 years it served the community by providing more than a couple thousand pounds of fresh produce to Open Door for distribution.

We have had more than 30 congregants who participated in this ministry over the years.
