Dear Siblings in Christ,

One of the great and joyful discoveries for me when I arrived at Grace, was to encounter the art and handcrafted pieces that have already adorned Grace's spaces so beautifully and then to meet the artists and craftspeople who created them. As both professional artist and pastor, I have long been very interested in the intersection of art and theology, and along the way created a ministry called "Artful Sanctuary" as a way to bring the arts and handcrafted creations into the worship space in service to the Word—that is, to allow us to use all of our senses along with objects of beauty proclaiming God's story so that we might encounter God's presence and grace for us through these gifts.

You may have noticed some new visual elements appearing in our worship space over the past few weeks along with the more familiar ones...crosses adorned with the colors of the season, cascading water jugs draped with fabric in iridescent hues to give the impression of flowing water, grapevine wreathes, handcrafted nails fashioned into a cross, a beautifully crafted candleholder made of birch and bloodwood, and a spectacular, sculpted tomb for Good Friday and Easter morning. These elements are the work of a Grace's new Artful Sanctuary Team. We're seeking to add layers of ritual symbolism to our communal worship experience. Multisensory worship is meant to deepen our

experience of God's Word through our 5 senses—our seeing, hearing, tasting, smelling, and embodying our ritual practice as we move through our 4-part order of worship each week: Gathering together, hearing God's Word, partaking in the Meal, and then Sending us out to proclaim what God has done for us.

There are many rich multisensory elements already present each week at Grace. Most evident is the richness of our auditory experience—we hear God's Word proclaimed through Scripture readings, preaching, and children's messages. We listen for the Gospel through the gift of music in the form of singing communal hymns, sung liturgy, and in the offering of special music by our Chancel Choir and Spirit of Grace Praise Band. We use our voices to confess our sins and then our ears to hear God's words of forgiveness. In our speaking with our communal voice, we affirm our faith in the words of the Creeds, actively respond to the words of liturgy, and lift our prayers to God.

Our senses of taste and smell are engaged as we come to the Lord's Table and partake of the gifts of bread and fruit of the vine. Our ritual practice becomes embodied in worship when we reach out and hold one another's hands to share the peace of Christ. We embody being the body of Christ when we turn our whole selves toward the baptistry and surround our newly baptized members and their families while we speak God's words of promise, welcoming these beloved ones into the family of God.

We're experimenting with new ways to deepen our experience of God's story, especially through our visual senses, by adding to the beautiful paraments, stained glass, woodwork, and banners already present in the sanctuary. As the seasons change throughout the church year, new elements will be incorporated to emphasize the richness of our worship and Scriptural themes.

With every new venture comes risk, but this risk also brings opportunity to experience the ancient, sacred story of God's love in a new light. Perhaps you are feeling drawn to this creative venture and want to be part of Artful Sanctuary to offer your gifts of creativity.

STRUNK FUND SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATIONS BEING ACCEPTED THROUGH 5/31

Letters of application are being accepted now through the end of May for scholarships for 2 or 4 year colleges, or trade schools. You must be enrolled as a full-time student, in an undergraduate degree program. You may only be eligible for this scholarship for a maximum of four (4) years. Awards will be given in July/August. The committee will announce the recipients of the scholarships in June. All applicants must be a baptized/confirmed member of Grace Lutheran Church and new applicants are required to write a letter of application which includes the following information:

- Your service and manner of attendance to Sunday School and church. If you are worshiping online at Grace, submit a selfie that shows you worshiping online OR a screen shot of the service.
- 2. List youth group activities, which must include service projects completed through Grace (i.e. work camps, work days, national youth gathering, etc.).
- 3. Your high school scholastic record if you are to start college, or past college records if you are in college presently. Copies of official transcripts must be included.
- 4. Name of school along with course selections and whether you will be a resident or commuter student.
- 5. Civic organizations and high school activities in which you participate.
- 6. If you previously received a grant from the Strunk Fund, the following information is required:
 - A. An official school transcript and list of your activities since your last application. College transcripts, must have a minimum 2.0 average to be eligible for consideration.
 - B. Participation in a service project either at college, in the community or the church and a letter from the organization, stating your involvement.
 - C. Regular worship attendance at a church or chapel, while at college. Worship may be:
 - 1- In-person (Submit bulletin or picture from worship service)
 - 2- Online (Submit selfie that shows you worshiping online OR screen shot of online service)
 - 3- Campus bible study group (Submit selfie that shows you with group)
 - D. Regular worship attendance at Grace, while home for breaks.

Applications are to be received by the church office by May 31st and be clearly marked as Strunk Fund Application. No applications will be accepted after May 31st. A submitted application does not guarantee a scholarship.
