## YOUTH NEWS

Hello! My name is Kaitlyn Stebner and I am a member of the congregation at Grace Lutheran Church in Royersford. A space for outdoor prayer is one thing that many communities lack. Creating an outdoor prayer garden and

labyrinth allows for people to be closest to whatever higher power they choose in a setting that invites peace. It will be a space that can be used for other community groups to have conversations that further the church's ministries outside of the church walls. My project would incorporate many different plants and pollinators that would have great benefits. A labyrinth is an ancient pattern with a single in-direct path to a clear destination and is intended to be a reflective experience.

In order to create this garden we plan to create a pathway using 8 inch by 8 inch paved belden bricks. The garden will have a paved center with a bench to create a space for anyone to use. To help bring this vision to life, we are offering the opportunity to purchase engraved bricks that will be used in the construction of the labyrinth and garden pathways. These personalized bricks are a meaningful way to honor a loved one, commemorate a special occasion, or leave a lasting mark of support within the community. The bricks are a 8x8 inch brick that features at max 6 lines and 18 characters with the option to add a logo as well. The sale will run until August 17th. The prices of the bricks range in personalization so the prices vary from \$45-\$65. A separate donation in any amount may be given as well. Kaitlyn will also be at church on 8/3, 10 & 17 to speak to anyone with questions or they can email if, anyone has questions or issues with an order.

Each contribution not only helps fund the project but also becomes a permanent part of this peaceful and sacred space. Thank you for considering being part of something special.

# Highlights from the last six months from Pastor Leah



It has been a joy to get to know this congregation as I move through my first year of shared ministry here at Grace! Having the sacred privilege of walking alongside the people of Grace as your pastor is not a calling I take lightly—I'm thankful for the holy moments I've been invited to be present in meaningful ways which include both times of sorrow and joy—for end-of-life care/funerals, preparing for marriages, a wedding, first communion, confirmation, baptisms, and an installation. I've enjoyed visiting in-person with you in your homes, on your porches, by phone, email, and text messages. I had a wonderful time getting to know some of our youth at Tuscarora, and it was enriching to be in service with Grace members at Project Outreach's food pantry.

I have really appreciated the openness this congregation has to trying new elements in worship while also bringing back the Lutheran sung liturgy that can bring a sense of comfort and familiarity. Highlights include becoming a member of the Hand Bell Choir and establishing an "Artful Sanctuary" team at GLC to incorporate visual elements into the worship space (including a Lenten installation, a handcrafted wooden candle holder for Good Friday, a fabulous Easter tomb, and a beautiful Pentecost hoop banner with ribbons and white doves). We've walked through Advent, Christmas, Lent, Holy Week, and Easter together, and even experienced fire dancing from Grace's baptismal font in remembrance of our baptism by water and Word with the promised gift of Holy Spirit fire.

Now, as we enter into this Time After Pentecost in the Church Year, we find ourselves in a season of growing in our faith. As we look toward a new program year and are planning for our fall ministries, there will be learning opportunities ahead for members of Grace to grow as disciples who follow in the way of Jesus. I will invite you to explore important aspects of our common life and the ways we are called to live and embody God's love as the body of Christ in the world. We will host conversation opportunities as we seek significant ways to live more deeply into our baptismal promises to strive for justice and peace and to stand in solidarity with the poor, the marginalized, and the oppressed—through learning and faithful action.

Please know that I am always open to sitting down for conversation and look forward to all that is yet to come. I am so grateful for this congregation's consistent generosity, for Grace's faithful ministry leaders and excellent staff members, and for all the ways I see the Holy Spirit moving in this place and among the people of Grace!

#### MID YEAR COUNCIL REPORT

At the midpoint of 2025, it is a good time to share and highlight some activities and accomplishments of your Church Council.

The Technology Committee, headed by Jim Butler continues to upgrade equipment and train new volunteers for the Tech Desk to enhance your worship experience.

Our Property Committee, chaired by Mark Rehrer and led by Property Manager, Steven Matzke, continues to handle numerous emergencies along with the day to day maintenance on our campus. Major repairs at the parsonage, A/C repair and replacements for Magic Memories in the Ed Building.....you name it, they take care of it.

Fellowship, chaired by Brenda Johnson, has hosted numerous functions, most notably the reception following Pastor Leah's installation. Details for an autumn picnic will be coming soon.

Social Ministry, led by Danielle Lau, continues to reach out into the community to help those in need.

Our Worship and Music Committee, under the leadership of Tammy Jordan coordinates with our rostered ministers to blend Grace traditions with new expressive forms of worship. The Artful Sanctuary Team was formed to bring the Gospel to life......and new hymnals are on their way. Julie Boyer continues to manage Christian Education, currently leading VBS.

Angela Feist, returning to Council after a one year hiatus, leads Faith Engagement.

Gavin Staface and Audrey Ibach represent the youth and young adults in our congregation.

Carly Bauer heads up Stewardship. You will be hearing more from her in the near future.

Mutual Ministry, led by Jack Perry, continues to search for a new Property Manager along with a DCE to fit our needs.

Financially, even though we are slightly below budget in congregational giving, it should be noted that we are \$10,000 greater in giving than last year at this time. We have signed a 5 year lease extension with Magic Memories that includes an additional 5 year option as they are very happy tenants. This provides significant financial security for Grace going forward. We also have extended the lease for Blair in the office apartment. Generous legacy gifts continue to generate income for the church, thereby enabling us to meet our obligations.

My thanks to the staff and all members of Council for their leadership in bringing great ideas forward for growth and sharing the good news through our actions in the community and beyond.

Additional gratitude for all volunteers who help in so many ways with the multitude of tasks required to hold worship services and keep Grace running efficiently. Feel free to reach out to the people mentioned above if you desire to serve in any other ministries.




# **Check Out These Ways to Support Your Faith Journey**
