Dear Siblings in Christ,



Every good and perfect gift comes from God above, and God is so good! That God gives good and perfect gifts for us is part of God's love story since the very beginning of time. God created everything, generously blessing creation with every gift to create and sustain life, and God called it all good, even very good. Then God made a covenant, a sacred promise, to Abram and Sarai that God would bless them in order that they would be a blessing for others throughout many generations with as many descendants as there are stars in the heavens.

God's people are blessed by God's promise to be a blessing!

Out of great love, down through these many generations, God's people have experienced blessing and the fulfillment of God's promise through the gift of Jesus Christ and his ministry of preaching, teaching, feeding, healing, restoring, welcoming, and blessing. From the Deacon's Desk: What is the Role of the Church Regarding Political Issues?

It is common for preachers, pastor, deacons, bishops & congregational leaders to hear from a congregational member that something is too political, when a topic they disagree with or are uncomfortable with enters into congregational discourse. And of course, that's understandable to an extent. Church is the place we come to for comfort, especially when the rest of the world seems so divided.



But while you will never hear either myself or Pastor Leah use the pulpit as a place to tell you what particular candidate to vote for or not vote for, there will be times when the pulpit is the place we call out the sinfulness of a particular action by the government, or a call to advocacy for a vulnerable group. It's important to remember that Jesus made many political stances himself and died as a result of sinful political actions.

While church is a place for comfort, it is also a place for challenge. As Christians, we are constantly challenged to seek where God's heart lies in a political act.

The ELCA this summer voted on a social statement called "Faith and Civic Life: Seeking the Well-being of All" which deals with this idea of the Church's role in the political and civic realm.
